Tiger Elective Adventure: Floats and Boats

Leader Instructions



1. With your den, say the SCOUT water safety chant.

The Water Safety Chant:

S is "Someone's Watching" never swim alone!
C is "Check the Rules" know where you can roam!
O is "Only Buddies" should go from the shore
U is "Know what U can do" Don't do anymore!
T is "Tell a grown-up" If someone's in need!
SCOUT shows safety now you take the lead!

2. Discuss why it's important to have a buddy and then play the buddy game.

Buddy Tag Game

This Game is meant for Cub Scouts. You will need at least 12 scouts, the more, the better

Instructions:

All players except for two form into buddy pairs and link one arm. Pairs spread out over an area. There is one player as '**It**' and one player being chased - the '**runner**'.

The '**runner**' may run up beside any buddy team and link his arm with one free arm of a buddy. This makes 3 scouts together, which is not allowed. So, the member of the buddy team that the '**runne**r' did not link arms with is now the '**runner**'.

'It' can tag the 'runner' at any point. As soon as he is tagged, he is 'It' and 'It' is now the 'runner'.

Usually, the tag is made when someone does not realize a 3rd has joined his team. Be careful about one scout being '**It**' for too long. Change the game by having 2 'Its' and 'Runners' at the same time.

- 3. Show how to safely help someone who needs assistance in the water, without having to enter the water yourself. [See flash cards]
- 4. [With your Den at another time] Show how to enter the water safely, blow your breath out under the water and do a prolonged guide

5. Identify five different types of boats.

Use the *Ships and Boats* book to learn about different types of boats. Then explore the museum galleries to see how many you can identify!

Bonus: Use materials found in our waterways room to make a boat. The included book, *A Kid's Book on Boat Building*, can help give them some ideas. This book can also help understand and identify the different sections on the wooden section in our lower gallery.
