### January 4, 2024 WAVES and SPARS:

Women of the Navy and Coast Guard in WWII

World War II wasn't just a man's war - over 350,000 American women served in the Armed Forces through programs like the Navy's WAVES (Women Accepted for Voluntary Emergency Service) and the Coast Guard's SPARS (Semper Paratus, Always Ready).

#### February 1, 2024 Keeping Girls Afloat: Black Girls Dive Foundation

Learn how Black Girls Dive Foundation empowers young Black women to explore STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) through marine science, conservation, and SCUBA diving.

#### March 7, 2024 Historic Housewives of Manitowoc

Cooking on an open fire, washing clothes by hand, keeping a diligent eye on the kids while also tending to some worn clothes in dire need of a patch job. This was common life for a woman back in pioneer times, and no woman was a stranger to this lifestyle. But our pioneer women also started libraries, classrooms, museums, and so much more. Discover the women movers and shakers in Manitowoc at the turn of the 20th century!

#### April 4, 2024 Spooky Lake Month: Environmental Education Through Art

Wisconsin-based hobby limnologist (freshwater scientist) and popular TikToker Geo Rutherford is well known for her series Spooky Lake Month where she highlights the spooky history and science behind a specific lake or water feature. Her videos have educated millions of people on the beauty, danger, and power of the waters that cover this planet.

## Mother Earth Water Walkers

Nokomis (Grandmother) Josephine Biidasige Mandamin dedicated her life to speaking for the Great Lakes and was an influential teacher and advocate for the Earth's water. In 2003 she began Mother Earth Water Walkers, where she along with other Nokomis walked the perimeter of the Great Lakes and Saint Lawrence Seaway.

#### June 6, 2024 SubPub Think & Drink: Victory at Sea

In 1952-53, NBC brought WWII into America's homes as network TV was in its biggest growth spurt. Victory at Sea's 26 episodes, with their vivid orchestra score and footage sourced from 14 warring nations, took viewers into every theater of the war. Join George Ferencz to hear the behindthe-scenes story of NBC's prizewinning WWII documentary series.

#### From the Sea to the Stars: The Life and Death of Laurel Clark

Astronaut Laurel Clark from Racine, WI was an accomplished doctor, U.S. Navy captain, and NASA astronaut who died aboard the space shuttle Columbia in 2003. Before she worked in space, Clark was the medical department head for a submarine squadron and performed numerous dives to evacuate submarines in medical emergencies.

# October 3, 2024

## Female Pirates

Despite pirates being a perennially popular topic, female swashbucklers are often overlooked. Learn about the women who found their freedom in the sea.

#### November 7, 2024 Ladies of the Light: Georgia Stebbins and Female Lighthouse Keepers

In 1873, forty-six years before women were allowed to vote in America, a lady by the name of Georgia Green Stebbins managed the North Point Lighthouse in Milwaukee. She became the longest-serving lighthouse keeper in North Point history, never missing a night for 26 years.

#### **December 5, 2024** Women on Submarines

In 2010, the ban on women serving on submarines was lifted. In 2022, two women made history: Lt. Cmdr. Amber Cowan became the first female Executive Officer on a submarine and Master Chief Information Systems Technician (Submarine) Angela Koogler became the first female Chief of the Boat.
